ASAP Annual Report

- Continue to participate in Pharmacy HIT Collaborative WG4. Current Project: Adverse Drug Events (Documentation and Reporting).
- Sent a letter to Congress regarding the Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act to educate on the ASAP PDMP Reporting Standard.
- Sent Letter to Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions in support of NABP PMP InterConnect for Interoperability and Data Sharing (has the support of the American Medical Association).
- Sent Letter to ONC on Accessing PDMP Data from Workflow using the ASAP Web Service Standard. The ASAP Standard was Included in the S&I Framework Prescription Drug Monitoring & HIT Integration Initiative.
- Sent notice to members on Tips for Reviewing HIPAA-required BA agreements.
- Conferences continue to get high marks for topics covered, speakers, locations, and networking opportunities.

ASAP Annual Report

- Brandeis University Best Practices Guidelines for PDMPs: Adopt Latest ASAP Reporting Standard.
- Version 4.2A includes a field for treatment type (for opioid dependency), a field for quantity prescribed, the ICD-10 code when provided by the prescriber, the XDEA number of the prescriber, and a field for transferred prescriptions. All are classified as optional/situational.
- Ohio was the first state to move to 4.2A and asking for the ICD-10 Code.
- Nebraska now using the ASAP standard to capture all prescriptions as a feed to its Health Information Exchange. This is getting national attention.
